## **REMINDERS**

### **CAR PARKS / SPEED LIMITS**

Our school car parks and driveways are busy at peak times - please remember to drive safely and vigilantly at 10km/h.

- Please park in designated spaces. Do not park unsafely on corners or where other cars cannot pass.
- The **Oval** is open for parking in the morning for drop off and afternoon for pick up. Please drive slowly with care.
- When using Daly Street carpark remember to walk your child along the pathways along fence lines into the school gate. Do not walk in the middle of the carpark where cars are travelling.
- When exiting School Lane onto Daly Street please note you cannot turn right during peak times.
- You can use Daly Street carpark as a kiss and drop or pickup zone by keeping in the middle but this process should not hold up traffic, so please do not park and be aware of other vehicles trying to keep moving.
- **East Terrace** parking - please do not park at the end of residents driveways restricting their access to their property

### **Gates:**

- Daly Street car park entrance gate is open all day.
- Lyndoch Road, School Lane and Oval gates are locked at 9.30am and reopened at 3.00pm, then relocked at 3.45pm.

## WHAT'S COMING UP

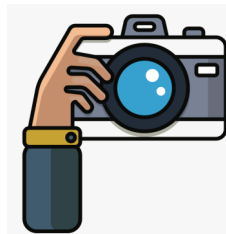
### Cup Cakes

- iGOSH will be open for those children who need care and bookings can be made now.

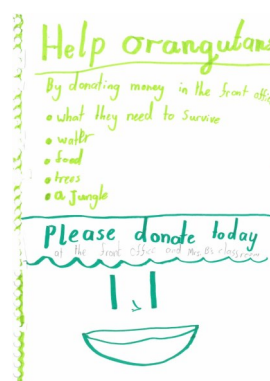
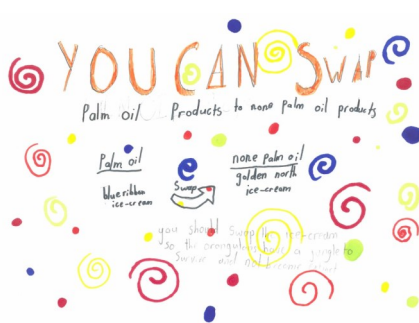
### Premier's Reading Challenge

### **LOTE**

Last semester students across the school enjoyed having the chance to learn German with Mrs Siviour.

This term Mrs Strickland has returned and will be taking students in Years 1 to 5 for Indonesian (Our Foundations will continue with German until the end of the year).

Students have done a wonderful job of getting started with this new learning. Students across the school will learn German and Indonesian until they reach Year 6.

Year 6 students have an opportunity to choose a language to work with for the year. Our goal for LOTE is that students will be engaged and enjoy learning languages, and may take up opportunities to delve deeper into language learning in high school and beyond.

### **Year 5 ICT**

Our Year 5 students had an opportunity this week to work with some very clever machines. The Edison robots are programmable robots which students can use to carry out a range of functions. Students worked with Mr Cochrane to learn some of the coding required to program the robots, then to get them to move around a course and follow directions. The Year 5s had to be good planners, thinkers and problem solvers to code the robots effectively.

### **Year 3 Language**

Our Year 3 classes have been working with procedural writing over the past few weeks. They have been learning about the importance of making instructions clear and using orderly sequences to get information across.

This week they practised their procedure writing with making jelly.



### **Circle Time**

This term has started with classes taking part in regular circle time sessions every Monday. Circle time is an opportunity for classes to meet regularly and work on building a positive class environment. They discuss particular focus areas and strategies which help them to understand themselves and get along with others. Circle time is also an opportunity to address issues which may arise in class or in the yard. Thanks to Mr Cochrane, who has provided classes with lots of circle time ideas and resources for Term 3.

Our Year 5 classes have been working on a unit about what we do and buy, the connections we have with people in other parts of the world and how our choices can affect them

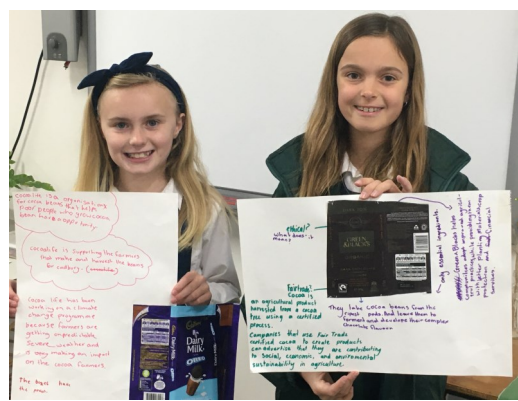
#### Central Idea:

#### Lines of Inquiry:

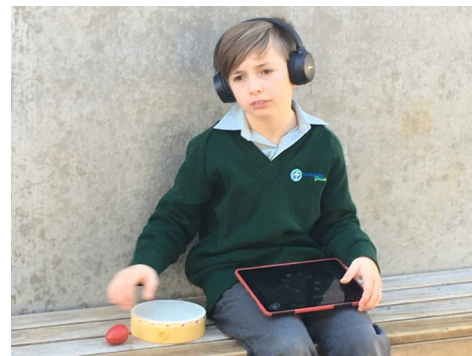
- The choices consumers have
