The theme for National Science Week 2020 is:

"Deep Blue: innovations for the future of our oceans".

This theme embraces the innovative technologies, capabilities and skills needed to achieve economic, environmental and social sustainability of our oceans. It features insights and inquiries into workable solutions that generate healthy oceans, healthy economies and healthy communities.

Our students were involved in a range of science activities, with Monday and Friday afternoons being devoted to science-based electives. Our Year 4-6 students also took part in a virtual presentation called *The Marine Team!* presented by Perform Education.

Year 1

The Year 1 classes have been working on a unit of inquiry focusing on communities:

Central Idea:

Communities provide services to meet people's needs

Lines of Inquiry:

- The different services within our community
- The roles of people who are part of our community
- How communities are organised


As part of their inquiry (and as a link with science week), they were visited by Mrs Roberts' daughter Jess who worked as a scientist. She led them through several experiments and demonstrations, such as mixing oil and water, using cabbage juice to identify acids and bases and modelling water molecules. They also did some experiments with salt water and fresh water.











The floating egg experiment with the Year 1's

Can you make an egg float in water? In this simple science experiment, it just takes just a few minutes to test the laws of density and discover just how easy it is to make an egg float!

What you need

- egg in its shell (it can be boiled or raw)
- an almost full glass of water
- 1 tsp of salt

Activity

- Carefully place the egg into the glass of water.
- Initially the egg will sink to the bottom.
- Pour in two teaspoons of salt and stir carefully around the egg.
- Continue to add the salt and stir until the egg rises.
- Eventually the egg will float as salt water is denser than fresh water and the egg will weigh less than the water.

Why does the egg sink in regular tap water, but float in saltwater? The answer lies in the density of water!

Density is a measure of the mass per unit volume of a substance. The egg will sink in regular tap water because the density of the egg is greater than the density of water. The egg's density is only slightly higher than water at 1.03 g/mL, but that is enough to make the egg sink. When you add salt to the water, you are increasing the density of the water by adding more mass (or stuff) in the given volume. You don't really change the volume of the water by adding salt. By adding enough salt, you increase the density of the water so that it is higher than the density of the egg and the egg will float!









Foundation Play Investigations

Our Foundation students have been busy in their play investigations sessions this week. They developed designs for some machines, devices and buildings, then used their designs to come up with some marvellous creations. It looked like a lot of fun.













Primary Years Program Term 3





Students were given a budget of \$100 to cater for a birthday party. They had to think of all the things they needed to buy including the invitations, the cake, the party food, the decorations, then stick to a budget and work out how much change they had left to save. They used iPads and searched different websites to find items for their party.

Giving students problems to solve, particularly the kind of problems people need to solve in everyday life, helps them to develop an understanding of maths concepts and to see where maths fits in the world around us.
