Year 6 Unit of inquiry

Our Year 6s have started the year with a unit on wellbeing and identity.

Central Idea:

People's choices influence personal wellbeing and identity

Lines of Inquiry:

- Aspects of wellbeing
- Connections between wellbeing and identity
- Making personal choices

As part of this unit, students are looking at how people are presented and this has involved looking at portraiture. They had an opportunity this week on Thursday to visit the Art Gallery of South Australia, to look at portraits and to hear from gallery staff about different aspects of painting and appreciating portraits. They followed this up by taking a short tour through the city marveling at street art and sculptures. This will compliment and inspire the students as they work towards goals in Unit of Inquiry throughout the year.

CURRICULUM

Year 3 Unit of inquiry

Our Year 3 classes have started the year with a look at places, what they mean to people and how they change.

Central Idea:

People, places and their connections change over time

Lines of Inquiry:

- Features of different places
- How places change and remain the same
- Relationships between people, places and change

They've started by looking at one place which has experienced a lot of change in the past and is experiencing a lot of change at the moment: Immanuel Gawler. They heard from Mr Trigg, who was here as a teacher when our school was very different, and they had an opportunity to go on a special preview tour of the new building to get an idea of how our school will change.





Year 4 Technologies

Our Year 4 students have had a big week, being presented with their iPads and spending a couple of sessions setting them up so they can begin with their 1:1 learning program.

The first step in using iPads is the iPad Boot Camp, which also started this week. Students will look at some of the features of the iPad they will be using regularly and they will look at areas such as digital citizenship, digital footprints, communicating online and cyber safety.

Our boot camp will also link to the Year 4s first unit of inquiry, which looks at appearance and behaviour.

Central Idea:

Appearance and behaviour project identity and influence attitudes

Lines of Inquiry:

- Appearance and behaviour as a form of expression
- The influence of cultural and social norms on how we choose to present ourselves
- The influence of appearance and behaviour on our perception of others

We will look at how people express themselves and represent themselves online and some of the safety issues around online environments, online communication and the people we might communicate with online.

Our iPads will give us great opportunities for communication, inquiry and creativity and we are looking forward to making the most of these new learning opportunities.





Peaceful Kids program

'Peaceful Kids' is a Mindfulness and Positive Psychology based program to lessen anxiety and stress and increase resilience in children. The program gives children the skills, practice and support to utilize coping strategies that lessen the symptoms of anxiety and stress. The program also

involves parental involvement and commitment to supporting the strategies at home.

Outcomes of the Peaceful Kids program:

- Lessen symptoms of anxiety and stress in children
- Teaches children to self-calm
- Empowers children to manage their own
- Develops emotional intelligence skills
- Teaches children life-long skills to manage stress and prevent stress build up
- Supports children so they know that they are not alone with suffering from anxiety

Program structure:

- Peaceful Kids is a 8 week program for children
- Sessions are for approximately 1 hour each week. (40-50 minutes for Rec and Year 1's)
- Sessions include learning a range of mindfulness strategies and meditations
- and positive psychology exercises.
