



CLASS CARERS


- We have now finalised a class carer for each class

It consists of 11 students, 5 parents,



The program also involves parental involvement and commitment to supporting the strategies at home.



SWIMMING

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Students have spent time in health and circle time sessions looking at how they can interact positively with each other. In their physical education lessons they have explored how this looks as people work together as a team. Students have been involved in a range of team games and team challenges. Our Year 4 students used the parachutes to play different games and make different shapes – like the circus tent.

MUSIC

We have been seeing (and hearing) some wonderful creative work from students in Years 2-4 as they have explored rhythm and beats using the djembe drums. Students have looked at how musical notation is used to show rhythm in written form and they have used this musical notation to write and play their own beats. It's been noisy, but a lot of fun.

YEAR 4 TECHNOLOGY

In our last newsletter we highlighted the Year 4 involvement in the iPad boot camp and the integration of boot camp into their unit of inquiry on appearance and behaviour. This week our Year 4 students completed their boot camp and have now been given responsibility for taking their iPads home. They have been looking forward to this for some time and we are looking forward to working with them on some of the wonderful learning experiences that will be available through our 1:1 iPad program.


