CABARET 2021


Our School Cabaret is scheduled for Friday 11 June starting at 6.30pm.



NATIONAL SIMULTANEIOUS STORY TIME

National Simultaneous Storytime (NSS) is held annually by the Australian Library and Information Association (ALIA). Every year a picture book, written and illustrated by an Australian author and illustrator, is read simultaneously in libraries, schools, pre-schools, childcare centres and many other places around the country. Now in its 21st successful year, it is a colourful, vibrant, fun event that aims to promote the value of reading and literacy, using an Australian children's book that explores age-appropriate themes, and addresses key learning areas of the National Curriculum for Foundation to Year 6.

This year, on **Wednesday May 19th 2021** (11am AEST), Give Me Some Space! by Philip Bunting was read live – by NASA astronaut Shannon Walker – from the International Space Station.

The year 1 classes had an excursion to the local Gawler Library to listen to the story plus partake in some science experiments.

CURRICULUM

THE ENHANCED PYP

Immanuel Gawler is an IB (International Baccalaureate) school, delivering the PYP (Primary Years Program).



In 2018 the IB introduced the Enhanced PYP, encompassing a wide range of improvements based on research and developments in education and feedback from IB schools. A key feature of the Enhanced PYP is student agency, giving students voice, choice and ownership in their learning. As we implement the Enhanced PYP at Immanuel Gawler we are looking at ways we can develop student agency in what we do.

YEAR 4 ACTION AFTERNOONS

Every Friday afternoon our Year 4 students take part in Action Afternoon. They are given an opportunity to focus on areas of their learning which have been of particular interest and to take action. This has led to involvement of students in a range of different interest projects, which have deepened their learning and further developed their understanding.





SPECIALIST LESSONS

Specialist lessons have also provided opportunities for students to exercise agency. In physical education lessons our Year 5 students have been taking part in games which they are creating themselves, developing their own rules and strategies and taking on umpires' roles to run the games.





In music lessons our Year 5 students have been working together to create their own musical pieces, using a range of different instruments. They have had to make decisions as a group about the part each group member and each instrument will play as they put the pieces together.





YEAR 3 ENGLISH

Students in Year 3 have been working on writing persuasive texts in preparation for NAPLAN. From here they have come up with some advertisements, which they have been filming this week.





CURRICULUM

Year 2 Unit of Inquiry

Our Year 2 classes have been working on a unit on how spaces are used as part of the theme, How we organise ourselves.



Central Idea:

Community needs influence the design and management of spaces

Lines of Inquiry:

- The features of spaces
- How spaces are used
- How communities design spaces for different purposes

This week they were busy developing designs for cities, looking at the types of services cities need and some of the reasons for where they are found.











Year 6 LOTE
