
## **BUILDING PROJECT**

As many of you will know, our new building project (referred to as the CU2 building) is coming along, but unfortunately it is quite a bit behind schedule. We had hoped to have it finished and be moved in by the end of this term but that is not going to happen. (The new building will house our Year 5s and Year 6s, the library and staff room.)

A complication to this is that we have to start the development of the rooms on the northern side of Taikondi (current Year 2 & 3 rooms) by the start of the mid-year break. If we don't, the contracts will need to go out to be re-tendered and we also put in jeopardy a substantial BGA grant we received to support this project.

So, we are in the position that we will need to do some interim changes until the CU2 building is completed. Following a lot of planning, thought and discussion, over the coming weeks the following changes will be made

- Year 6's will relocate to the East Terrace house (until the CU2 building is ready)
- Year 2's will relocate to the Senior Unit (until the Taikondi refurbishment is finished, which we anticipate will be late in term 4)
- Foundation Blasche will relocate to the Photocopier Room, which is Room 1 next to Year 3 M/S (until the CU2 building is complete)
- Year 3 Rollings / Tilbrook will relocate to the Foundation Blasche Room (until the CU2 building is complete and then they will move into the current Year 5 rooms until the end of the year)

Cabaret is one of our biggest events of the year and is a wonderful evening to enjoy with your family and the school community.


Be entertained with music and dance performances by our many talented students, staff and special guests. It will be a very entertaining night.

#### NATIONAL RECONCILIATION WEEK

#### "More Than A Word. Reconciliation Takes Action"

Reconciliation is a journey for all Australians – as individuals, families, communities, organisations and importantly as a nation. At the heart of this journey are relationships between the broader Australian community and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

This week we have participated in various activities relating to National Reconciliation Week.

Our year 1 & 2 classes and our indigenous group of students and friends attended the Gawler Kadlitiya Kids fun day on Thursday 3 June at the Gawler Sport and Community Centre.

Students participated in various activities such as basket weaving, rock painting, damper making and many other fun activities, music and craft.

The year 6 students took a trip to Parridla Taikondi Park (located on Lawrence Ave at Gawler South). This is the junction of the North and South Para and Gawler Rivers. The junction is significant to Kaurna people, the traditional custodians of the area. The name Parridila Taikondi - Parri is a Kaurna word for river and parridla means rivers. Taikondi is the Kaurna word for coming together.

















## **CURRICULUM**

#### Year 5 Unit of inquiry

Our Year 5 classes have been working on two different units of inquiry. They have just begun a unit of inquiry based on the theme of **How we organise ourselves**.

#### Central Idea:

Justice systems affect and reflect the communities people live in

#### Lines of Inquiry:

- Purposes of justice systems
- Elements of justice systems
- Effectiveness of justice systems

They have also been working on a year long unit based on the theme of **How** we express ourselves.

#### Central Idea:

We use our imagination to express ideas creatively

#### Lines of Inquiry:

- What motivates creativity
- Different ways of expressing ideas
- Critiquing and reflecting on artistic expression

As part of their inquiry into these units they visited the Adelaide Goal

last Wednesday 26 May to find out about the corrections aspect of the justice system and how this has changed over time.

Following this they walked the streets of Adelaide and spent some time looking at and reflecting on the creative street art and murals created as part of the Adelaide Fringe Street Art Explosion.























## **CURRICULUM**

#### YEAR 6 UNIT OF INQUIRY

The units of inquiry studied as part of the Primary Years Program (PYP) are transdisciplinary – they cover content across a range of curriculum areas. The Year 6 students have been inquiring into media and advertising as part of a unit based on the theme of *How we express ourselves*.

#### Central Idea:

Media and advertising influences our thinking

#### Lines of Inquiry:

- The purposes of media
- The manipulation of images, words and sounds to create messages
- The effects of media on our thinking

Students are involved in some exciting learning as part of this unit. They are in the process of setting up food vans, serving food which they are cooking as part of the kitchen garden program. The food being served is international cuisine, from countries students are studying as part of their LOTE program. Students are using persuasive techniques, which they are learning through the language component of this unit, to create advertisements for their food trucks.

Some of our teachers had a real treat this week when they were asked to sample some of the dishes the students are putting together – there were some fantastic cooking skills on display.




#### **YEAR 6 CHRISTIAN STUDIES**
