SAKG STUDENT REPORT

In this weeks lessons we have been making veggie dips and flat bread. The focus for today's lesson is making the flat bread. Flatbread is a non rising bread which matches really well with the veggie dips which we found surprising.

LEEK AND SPINACH DIP RECIPE

3 leeks	1/2 teaspoon red wine vinegar
1 1/2 tablespoons olive oil	1/2 teaspoon salt
4 cups coarsely chopped silver beet	1/2 cup plain Greek yogurt
1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper	
2 tablespoons chopped fresh chives	

Step 1

Remove and discard root ends and dark green tops of leeks. Cut each leek in half lengthwise; rinse thoroughly under cold running water to remove grit and sand. Thinly slice leeks crosswise to equal about 4 cups.

Step 2

Heat a large skillet over medium-low. Add oil; swirl to coat. Add leeks to pan; cook 25 minutes or until very soft and caramelized, stirring occasionally. Stir in spinach, salt, and pepper; cook 2 minutes, stirring until spinach wilts. Remove pan from heat; cool leek mixture completely.

Step 3

Combine yogurt, chives and vinegar in a bowl. Stir in spinach mixture. Refrigerate until ready to serve.



CURRICULUM NEWS

Year 1 UOI - Our Year 1 students have been learning about directions and mapping. They spent a morning completing a Scavenger Hunt around the school to find where particular places or people are and working out the directions on a map to get there.

Year 2 UOI

Our Year 2 students have started work on a unit about life cycles and the natural world.

Central idea - Living things depend on each other as they develop

Lines of inquiry:

- Life cycles of plants and animals
- Relationships between living things and their offspring
- The interdependence of people and other living things

As part of their inquiry into this unit, students are starting to have all sorts of living things growing in their classrooms, including seedlings, silk worms and sea monkeys.

Year 6 Exhibition

Our Year 6 students have started on the process of preparing for this year's PYP Exhibition.

The Exhibition is the culmination of students' participation in the IB Primary Years Programme, where students apply skills, understandings and attitudes they have developed throughout their time in the program to inquire into an issue of significance in our world.

The Exhibition is based on the transdisciplinary theme of Sharing the Planet.

Students began with a provocation, travelling around Gawler by bus and on foot to observe and identify possible issues in our own community. From here they will look further at the theme of Sharing the Planet and how the issues they have identified might link with this theme, before getting together in groups to inquire in depth into their issue.

The Year 6 students put together some collages to highlight some of the issues they might look into for the 2021 Exhibition.
