## DEVOTION

This term we will hear about prayer – it will be the focus for our Worship and Praise each Friday. It's a word we hear often and it comes up in different expressions:

"An answer to prayer"

"In our thoughts and prayers"

"On a wing and a prayer"

What are we talking about when we talk about prayer? A dictionary definition is this:

"A solemn request for help or expression of thanks addressed to God or another deity."

A Christian writer explained it this way:

"Prayer isn't a magical formula for getting what we want, and it isn't reserved for 'holy' people, or for special times or places. Prayer is talking to God."

Prayer might involve a number of things for Christians:

It can be a way of acknowledging God and God's role in the world and people's lives, a way of reflecting on ways we have fallen short and how we can do better, it can be a way of thinking about people we care about and remembering others who might need help or situations where help is needed.

As we focus on prayer in Worship and Praise, we will give particular focus to The Lord's Prayer.

Through this, Jesus teaches his followers some important things about prayer:

That people can relate to God through prayer, that God provides what we need rather than what we want, that we make mistakes, that God forgives us and that we should forgive others. We'll look forward to seeing how our teachers unpack this in the coming weeks.

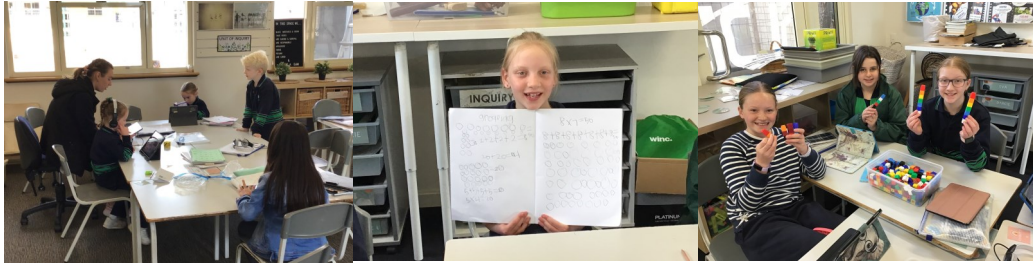
## PETER COOMBE VISITS IMMANUEL

## CURRICULUM NEWS

Things have been a little quieter than usual over the first couple of weeks. Going into lockdown on Day 3 of the term has meant a number of our in-class activities, as well as some excursions, have had to be postponed or cancelled.

Here is an insight into our learning during the first few weeks across the school – some of it in-class, some online.



## **CURRICULUM NEWS CONT....**

**Foundation** have been looking at our environment and our responsibility to care for living things in our unit of inquiry, and at how God cares for people. We have been doing some maths work on location and on teen numbers, and we've been continuing to familiarise ourselves with letters, sounds and blends.

**Year 1** have started a unit of inquiry on materials and we've been looking at the church in the local community. Our maths is focusing on 2D and 3D shape and we are writing information reports and procedures.

**Year 2** are starting a unit of inquiry on the central idea, Ecosystems consist of interdependent organisms and we're looking at what the Bible says about caring for the environment. We are working on multiplication in maths and looking into information reports and sentence skills in English.

**Year 3** are looking at how culture expresses the same features in different ways and looking at how different religions are a part of culture. We are doing some maths work on length, mass, capacity and money, and we are working on information reports and developing more sophisticated sentences by expanding simple sentences.

**Year 4** have started a unit of inquiry on the central idea, Earth's surface changes in gradual and dramatic ways – unfortunately our excursion to look at landforms in Clonlea Park could not go ahead in Week 1. Our Christian Studies lessons are focusing on the Christian concepts of sin and grace. We are looking at shape in maths and in English we are looking at persuasive texts and information reports.

**Year 5** are looking at how our choices as consumers impact other people in our unit of inquiry – unfortunately our chocolate shopping trip couldn't go ahead in Week 1. On a related theme we are looking at Christian responsibility in the world as part of our Christian Studies. We are working on fractions in maths and doing some writing work on sentence skills.

**Year 6** first unit of inquiry for Term 3 is Energy transforms our world and we are looking at natural disasters and sources of energy. We are looking at the parables of Jesus in Christian Studies, at fractions in maths and at book reviews and sentence skills in English.

**LOTE** - LOTE classes have been looking at a range of topics, including exploring the world, feelings and emotions, families and identity and counting

**Music** - Our younger students are looking at world music and playing some basic instruments (recorder and boom whacker), while our upper primary students have begun to look at preparations for concert.

**PE** - With the Olympics on, all of our classes are having a look at athletics, following the IAAF kids athletics program. This program focuses on throwing, running and jumping skills.

Our **SAKG** (Kitchen Garden) program is one that we've been able to continue during our time of COVID-19 restrictions. Despite not being able to have volunteers onsite, we had our Year 5 students introduced to the garden program last Tuesday and to kitchen this Wednesday.





## MARINATED OLIVES

Mrs Kreymborg has been busy making marinated olives from produce collected in the schools' garden and making them into lovely pots of delicious marinated olives. Our garden grows an abundance of different fruit and veggies that our students use in the SAKG lessons such as figs, spinach, pumpkins, herbs and more. Below is a recipe if you would like to try making your own.

### RECIPE

#### INGREDIENTS

500g olives  
 2 strips lemon zest  
 1 tablespoon fresh rosemary leaves  
 A couple of sprigs fresh thyme  
 1 medium garlic clove  
 1/2 cup extra-virgin olive oil

#### PREPARATION

Combine the olives, lemon zest, rosemary, and thyme in an attractive jar that has a cover. Bury the garlic clove in the centre, add the oil, stir, cover, and refrigerate until you need it, up to several weeks. Give the mixture another stir now and then to blend. You could try other flavours: herbs such as tarragon, other citrus peels, chilis, seasoned oils- try whatever you like.
