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## BUILDING PROJECTS UPDATE

As you know, we currently have two significant building projects on the go. It had been planned that the new building on the Western side would be completed before starting the 'heritage building' refurbishment... but it didn't work out that way.

So, we pass on a massive thank you to our school community, especially staff and students for the willingness to adapt and overcome the issues of losing six teaching and learning spaces for several months.

The new building on the western side of our school has been colloquially called CU2 during the development process. At this stage we are anticipating handover during the week of the 20th September (Week 10 this term.) So... fingers crossed... we'll be able to relocate our Yr 5 and Yr 6 students in there for the start of term 4 this year. The building has three levels, the upper being a staff room, the ground floor housing Yr 5 and the lower floor will be for Yr 6 and a Library / Learning Hub. This building is over 700 sq meters and will provide outstanding spaces for students to learn in both large and small groups. It has toilets and IT / Green rooms and outstanding thermal / environmental qualities. (The photo attached is from this date in 2020!!)

The Heritage Refurbishment is set to finish mid-term 4 and this will house our Yr 2 and Yr 3 grades. With the walls knocked out, as you can see in the photos, we are opening up the space to provide greater flexibility for the learning programme.





## SCHOOL CONCERT

This year our Upper Primary classes (4,5,6) are performing in our School concert. It will take on a different format this year due to our building works and Covid Restrictions. Each class will have their own theme and their performance will be recorded and uploaded onto Seesaw for Parents and caregivers to enjoy from home. More information will be available soon.

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## SCIENCE WEEK

We have a couple of big weeks coming up. Science Week runs from 14th to 22nd August. The theme this year is *Food: Different by Design*. Classes will be looking at different activities around this theme during the week.

Our celebration of Science Week will continue on Tuesday 24th and Thursday 26th August, when the Marine Discovery Centre will be visiting. They will give students an opportunity to take part in some interactive science learning activities based around marine environments, sustainability and Aboriginal education. We are really looking forward to their visit and we are grateful to the P & F for organising this event for us.

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## BOOK WEEK

Book Week is 21st to 27th August this year and the theme is "Old Worlds, New Worlds, Other Worlds".

Our Book Week Dress Up Day will be held on Friday 27th August. Students can dress up in a costume based on this theme or as a favourite book character.

## Seasonal Fruit Muffins

**Season:** All

**Makes:** 24 small or 36 mini muffins

**Fresh from the garden:** eggs, seasonal fruit

Choose fruit that you have in season and that you think will work well in a muffin.

### Equipment:

metric measuring cups  
clean tea towel  
chopping board  
cook's knife  
bowls – 1 large, 1 small  
2 mixing spoons  
24-hole or 36-hole muffin tray  
baking paper (optional)  
wire cooling rack  
serving platters

### Ingredients:

3 cups self-raising flour  
1 cup castor sugar  
1 cup natural yoghurt  
2 eggs  
 $\frac{3}{4}$  cup sunflower oil, plus extra for greasing  
2 cups seasonal fruit, roughly chopped

### What to do:

1. Preheat the oven to 180°C.
2. Mix the flour and sugar together in the large bowl.
3. Create a well in the centre of the flour mix.
4. Mix together the yoghurt, eggs and oil in the small bowl.
5. Pour the egg mix into the flour and gently combine, gradually adding the chopped fruit (don't over work the batter).
6. Spoon the mixture into lined or lightly greased muffin tins.
7. Place the trays into the oven and bake for 20–25 minutes.
8. Cool for 5 minutes on wire racks before serving.
9. Transfer to your platter to serve.



## CURRICULUM NEWS

Things have returned to normal a little after our eventful start to the term and learning programs are looking a little bit more like what they were pre-lockdown. Here are a few of the things that are going on at school at the moment.

### **The Writing Revolution**

At the end of last term, teachers at Immanuel engaged in some professional learning on writing and we looked at a program called The Writing Revolution. This program focuses on students learning to write effectively and accurately by building their proficiency with the writing process from sentence level, to paragraph level to the level of written compositions. Teachers looked at a range of skills and strategies which can help students develop their understanding of different aspects of writing. We have commenced the term with a focus on teaching students these skills and strategies and linking them to what we are doing in our units of inquiry.

### **Year 1 Unit of inquiry**

Our Year 1 students are inquiring into materials as part of their unit based on the theme - How the world works.

Central idea: We understand more about materials by exploring them

Lines of Inquiry: • The characteristics of materials  
• How materials change • How and why different materials are used

They have been looking at different features of materials and carrying out some construction work with different materials. They will be moving on to carrying out experiments into changes that materials go through under different conditions.

### **Year 4 Maths**

Our Year 4 students have been looking into area as part of their maths learning. They have been looking at what area is and how it can be measured with non-standard units. Some of them have looked at the potential problems that might arise when using non-standard units and they have been introduced to the square centimetre as a standard unit.

### **Year 5 and 6 ICT electives**

Our senior students have started another round of ICT electives this week. Students will have an opportunity to take part in an extended series of sessions in photography, design, movie making, visual art, animation and coding. This program has been introduced in 2021 with the help of Mr Cochrane and our ICT support company, Prosperity IT. We have been really happy with the response to this program and the way students have engaged with it.
