Music



CURRICULUM UPDATE

It's been a very unusual start to the year and things have been pretty different in our classrooms. It has been great to see we've had some interesting learning and engaged students both at school and online. We are very grateful to our teachers, LSA's and iGOSH staff for supporting the students with online learning. Here is what we have been up to!

Foundation

Our Foundation classes have already started to look at sounds and letters as well as counting strategies. They are inquiring into ways we stay safe at school, starting with being sun smart.

Year 1

Our Year 1s are also looking at counting strategies and how numbers help us identify groups. They have started finding out about celebrations as part of their unit of inquiry and looked into Australia Day and Chinese New Year.

Year 2

In Year 2, students have been looking at character strengths & how these contribute to building a positive environment.

Vear 3

The Year 3 classes have started inquiring into health & the different aspects of health (physical, mental, social, emotional, spiritual) & the different factors which influence our health.

Year 4

Our Year 4 students are starting the year by looking at appearance & behaviour, what influences people's appearance and behaviour, what it says about people and how it is perceived by others.

Year 5

In Year 5 students have started the year by looking at what makes a positive community & how self-awareness can help people contribute to a positive community.

Year 6

The Year 6s are inquiring into the way our experiences, our choices & the challenges we face can help to shape our identity.

Languages Other Than English – LOTE classes have started with a look at what we know about the world & where we might have connections. Students will also be looking at communication in different parts of the world.


PE

Some topics covered include: privacy and personal information, cyberbullying and digital footprints. Teachers have also been referring to our school's ICT Acceptable Use Agreement either in class or online. We encourage families to continue the conversations with their children at home around being respectful and responsible digital citizens.
