Who do you follow?

I'm not thinking in a literal sense. Who do you look up to? Maybe you follow celebrities or influencers on Instagram, Facebook, YouTube etc or maybe a sport star!

Often influencers lead us to make decisions, to change our thinking, to buy products we don't need, but would like to have because they're trending, or someone popular has them. We follow them because what they share, post or promote is in some way relevant to our lives.

Constantly without even realising we are influenced by marketing, by advertisements, on social media, on billboards, signs, bus stops, on notice boards, TV, radio, everywhere we look. When something is new, exciting or newsworthy it is always shared on a public notice board, either online or on signs in the community.

MESSAGE FROM DARYL

I hope and pray that this newsletters finds you and your families going OK.

In recent times staff and families have been connecting through (on line) Learning Conferences) and I hope these have been mutually beneficial. We know that there have been a number of disruptions to the learning programme but I continue to congratulate and admire the way every one has gone about doing the very best they can for the children here at Immanuel. At the time of writing this we expect that there will be an imminent announcement on the coming few weeks in terms of expectation, regulations and restrictions. Again, at the time of writing this, we have only heard of one positive case in our school this week which is indeed very positive. We still have a number of families in isolation and community members who are ill and we continue support them the best ways we can – through prayer and action. Our attendance this week has also been pleasing, as it has hovered just below 80% with Covid related matters.

It continues though to be really important that children do not come to school if they have any symptoms and they are tested as soon as possible. And that if there is a positive case that we are informed about it as soon as possible.

A short while ago I updated our community on the plans to relocate Zion Preschool onto the Immanuel site. This week the project team began meeting with Architects to determine who will lead us through the next design stage and this is very exciting. Zion Preschool and Immanuel formally amalgamated during 2021 and so co location is an obvious step towards maximising what our schools can do to support those in our community.

You will have received some invites from a website called Operoo. This is an online platform that we are adopting to make the process of communications and permission for excursions and camps more efficient and easy. The Operoo system will mean that families no longer need to track and sign paper copies and can update us with medical issues far more easily. Operoo is an extension of our current data base system and so the data is held with the same regard to privacy. The platform will also allow us to calculate and manage 'risk' around camps and excursions in a very thorough and effective way. Our Yr 3s and Yr 1s are the first to use the system as planning happens for the Yr 3 Monarto Camps and the Yr 1 Zoo excursion.

On behalf of our school community, I thank you for your support of our school. Please don't hesitate to speak to any of us if you have any concerns or suggestions for improvement.






HARMONY DAY

CURRICULUM NEWS

Year 1 PMP

Our Year 1 students have been taking part in the Perceptual Motor Program (PMP) this term. PMP is a movement-based program which helps younger students improve their eye/hand and eye/foot coordination, their fitness, balance, locomotion and eye-tracking skills. They take part in a range of fun, hands-on activities which help them in developing this range of physical skills.

Year 2 Unit of Inquiry

Our Year 2 classes have commenced a unit based on the transdisciplinary theme, How we organise ourselves. Students will be looking at places and spaces and why they are set up the way they are. Central Idea: Community needs influence the design and management of spaces

Lines of Inquiry:

The features of spaces

How spaces are used

How communities design spaces for different purposes To see an example of how spaces are set up to meet different purposes, students took a trip through the

local Gawler area to look at how some key places are set up and why that might be the case.



Our Year 5 and 6 students have been taking part in technology electives this term. We have teamed up with our technology providers, Prosperity IT, to lead students in a range of different activities each Friday including movie making, design, visual art, photography and animation. It has been a very enjoyable and engaging experience for our students.

It has been an exciting week with our new 3D printers arriving ready for the students to explore. Leyland has been keen to experiment with these clever machines.

Measure 1 full dessert spoon of the mixture and roll into balls


Makes approx. 10-12 balls.
