In John 5, we find Jesus in Jerusalem, walking by the Pool of Bethesda. He spotted a man who had been lying by the pool for 38 years waiting for someone to help him into the pool. Imagine spending 38 years lying beside a pool of water, waiting to be healed. Jesus, knowing the man's condition and long years of waiting, asked him if he wanted to be healed. 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## MESSAGE FROM DARYL

I hope this newsletter finds you all doing ok. It's hard to imagine that we have just passed the half way mark of the term and while it's been a somewhat disrupted term, it's great to be getting back to some of our old routines like meeting together for Assembly and Worship.



We know that many in our school community are currently dealing with Covid (on a variety of levels) but at school we have been fortunate enough in the last fortnight to only have had two students attend on site while infectious. (We will continue to let families know if a student has attended while infectious for families in that particular year level.)

SA Health has notified us that from Monday 30<sup>th</sup> May mandatory mask wearing will be lifted from schools. Certainly people are welcome (and encouraged) to continue wearing masks indoor and should we have a significant out break we will be required to return to mask wearing for the following 14 days. (A significant out break has been defined as where an individual class reports 10 cases or above over 7 days; and or where a site reports 5 classes with 5 cases or more over 7 days.)

### FRENCH TOAST RECIPE

5 slices of wholemeal bread	2 eggs
1 tspn vanilla essence	1/2 cup milk
Olive oil	1 Banana

Heat oil in fry pan  
Whisk egg, vanilla essence and milk in a bowl  
Dip the bread pieces in the egg mixture  
Fry on both sides,  
Serve with sliced Banana, cinnamon or maple syrup

## CURRICULUM NEWS

### Local, global, connected

At Immanuel, students learn that our community in Gawler is part of a much larger global community. In our units of inquiry, we look at issues from the perspective of our local community but we also think about what these issues look like in other parts of the world. This is part of being internationally minded.



This week we had a chance to make some connections between our local community and people in another part of the world. Students in Year 6 and Foundation got together to connect to a couple of their classmates via video link. Fawwaz and Ermina are currently in Pakistan for a family trip and they contacted us from there. We found out about what they were doing and students had a chance to ask them questions about what Pakistan is like and how people live in Pakistan.

### Year 2 Unit of inquiry

Our Year 2 students are looking into a unit of inquiry about spaces and how they are organised.

Central Idea: Community needs influence the design and management of spaces

Lines of Inquiry:

- The features of spaces
- How spaces are used
- How communities design spaces for different purposes

Last week they had an opportunity to look at how spaces are designed and used by visiting the city, looking at a number of different places and discussing their purpose and how they have been planned. They followed this by visiting Adelaide Oval and looking at the range of activities that take place there, and the way the stadium is set up to cater for all these different activities. It was a great day out.

### Year 5 and 6 Phys Ed

Our Year 5 and 6 students have been working on a range of different sports recently, which have a focus on touch, finesse and precision. They tested themselves this week in Taikondi, trying to develop their skills with pong and trying to control the bias with some carpet bowls. They did well with some pretty challenging tasks.

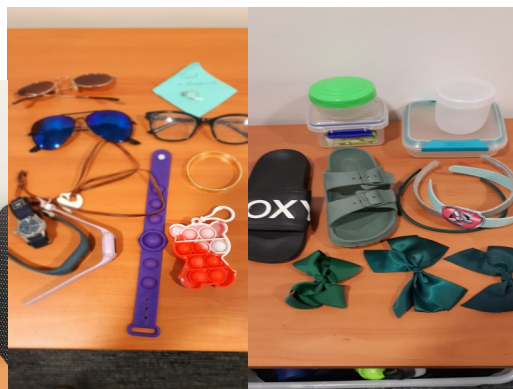
