I hope this newsletter finds you all doing well. Especially those in our community who have Covid at the moment.

You may have noticed some new fencing on the Southern boundary of our oval? This area is going to be a new nature play area — with great visibility from the oval, yet safe between the fences, this will be a space for kids to fossick and play in a natural environment. And we think the kids will love it too.

We are also in the process of gathering quotes to renew the JP playground and rubberize the ground underneath it – hopefully as a Christmas holiday job and this too is very exciting. If you know of any great JP playgrounds that are worth having a look at, we'd be keen to know.

Plans to relocate the Zion Preschool onto our site are rolling along. We've been working through floor plans and site structures and this facility will be a combination ELC / Dept. of Education (Preschool) for approximately 66 children a day for the 12 months before starting in Foundation. Our target for opening is the start of 2024 but we are aware that this might need some adjustments along the way given the current building climate. Again, a very exciting venture.


CURRICULUM NEWS

Foundation Maths

Our approach to learning at Immanuel Gawler focuses on concepts or big ideas that we want students to understand.

Our Foundation students have been focusing all year on numbers and counting. We want them to develop an understanding of what numbers mean, how they can be

represented and how we can use them more effectively by breaking them down and building them up in different ways.



Year 5 Unit of inquiry

A key focus of the IB is helping students to develop as internationally-minded people who recognise they are part of local and global communities. We encourage students to explore their connections with others nearby and around the world. Our Year 5 students are doing this by finding out about how they are connected through what they buy and consume.

The classes took a trip to the supermarket to buy chocolate. They looked at what considerations are important to them when making their purchases and they started on some finding out about different types of chocolate.

SAKG Spring Rolls Recipe- Maybe you could try making these at home?

1 packet of Spring Roll wrappers (must be thawed night before) but kept in packaging (available from Woolies or Coles freezer section)

Vermicelli noodles Salt and pepper to taste

2tbsp of cornflour 1 x carrot

1 x zuchinni Any other vegetables

METHOD: Pre heat oven to 200 degree celsius Soak noodles in warm water for 10 minutes

Grate carrot, zucchini & squeeze the juice out, Grate or finely chop other vegetables being used. In a bowl mix 1 tbsp of cornflour with 2 x tbsp of cold water

Add grated vegetables and Sprinkle with salt and pepper to taste, Add noodles into mixture Open spring roll pack & place a wet cloth or paper towel over it to keep the wrappers moist In a small bowl mix 1 tbsp of cornflour with 2 tbsp of water

Carefully pull out the wrapper slowly from the pack as they can tear very easily Place on the bench in a diamond shape facing you.

Scoop up 1 – 2 tbsp of mixture & place neatly at the pointed section of the wrapper

Fold the tip closest to you over the mixture

& tuck the sheet under the mixture, then fold both left & right corners over the mixture & tightly roll your mixture towards the other tip

Use fingers dab some cornflour water onto the tip so the wrapper will stick

You should end up with a spring roll

Place spring rolls on a baking tray covered



with baking sheet and cook in the oven till crispy golden brown, approx. 10-15 mins
