It was always long, hot, boring and tiring for me and my siblings, there were fights and complaints and it could be frustrating and stressful for my parents. The journey was worth it though, because we got to spend quality time with relatives and friends we didn't see very often.

If we look at life as a journey, there are a lot of similarities. There are boring parts, stressful parts, it can be frustrating, confusing, tiring, you can get a little lost and you don't always get along with your fellow travellers.

What is the goal of this journey? A lot of the things we spend our time pursuing wear out, break down or disappear. We will go the same way. Is that all we have to look forward to? The last book of the Bible gives an alternate description of life's final goal:

"Now God's home is with people! ...God himself will be with them... He will wipe away all tears from their eyes. There will be no more death, no more grief or crying or pain. The old things have disappeared." Revelation 21:1-4

At the start of this week I was at a funeral – for someone I knew very well. He had been on a journey for 91 years. The last part of his journey was in the hospital and he knew it was going to be over

soon. He wasn't sad though, or afraid. He was looking forward to the goal of his journey. The last message he left was something he got a nurse to write down on a big paper bag for his wife. It just said, "Gone to Heaven." That sounds like a pretty good way to finish.

Tjupurru captivates students with his extraordinary live interactive performance. Students contribute as he interacts with them using his Face Bass - a unique seismic sensor, to create ingenious and innovative songs and sound-scapes that blend elements of the traditional with contemporary, using a combination of masterful sequencing and sampling technologies along with traditional instruments and live organic sounds.


