A Life of Work, Service and Faith

The Hebrew word 'Avodah' comes up quite a bit in the old testament and is used in various contexts. It is amazing how a word from one language can't just easily translate to another. An English translation of this word cannot be tied down to one word but three: Work, Service and Worship. The ancient Hebrews had a deep understanding of how 'faith' and 'work' were not separate principles but worked together in their lives.

This week we commemorate the life & service of Queen Elizabeth II. She is truly someone who personified the idea of 'Avodah'. From a very young age her life was dedicated to a life of service to her people and the people of the Commonwealth. Whether you are a royalist or not, one can respect her devotion and sense of duty. She is someone who also had a strong Christian faith.

'Pray for me ... that God may give me wisdom and strength to carry out the solemn promises I shall be making, and that I may faithfully serve Him and you, all the days of my life.'

That was the prayer request made by Queen Elizabeth II in her first Christmas broadcast in 1952. Her prayer must have been answered. A symbol of strength, unity and faith till the end.


FATHERS DAY STALL

PARENTS AND VISITORS TO IMMANUEL DURING THE DAY

Please be reminded that all parents and visitors arriving at Immanuel during the day (outside of normal drop off and pick up times) MUST report to the office, prior to proceeding to a classroom or other area of our school.

If you are volunteering you need to sign in at our sign in register and collect your name badge.

If you are dropping off or collecting a student during the day or needing to come on site for any other reason, please report to the office on arrival and the admin staff will assist you.

Please use the Daly Street carpark and gate to enter the school as all other gates (Lyndoch Rd, Oval and Tennis Court gates) are locked during the day.

STUDENT MEDICATION REMINDERS

Any medication required to be administered during school (eg, Ventolin, EpiPen, Antihistamine and other) must be accompanied by a school medication administration form signed by the parent, along with a medical practitioner's action plan and chemist labelling on the medication.

The Parent needs to accept responsibility for the accuracy of all information and for ensuring that supplies of officially labelled medication are available and in date.

Panadol/Paracetamol medication: Immanuel school will not dispense Panadol/Paracetamol. This is done in the interest of children's health. If you require your child to have this type of medication it will need to be sent along to the school office in the chemist packaging and label, with a note signed by the parent/caregiver indicating dosage and time to be administered.

CURRICULUM UPDATE

The aim of all IB programs is to develop internationally minded people who can help to create a better and more peaceful world. Through the Primary Years Programme (PYP) students are encouraged to develop attributes of the IB Learner Profile.

PYP Exhibition

The PYP Exhibition provides opportunities for students to develop and demonstrate all attributes of the Learner Profile: Inquirers, Knowledgeable, Thinkers, Communicators, Principled, Open-minded, Caring, Risk-takers, Balanced and Reflective.

Our Year 6 students have begun preparations for the PYP Exhibition, which takes place in Term 4. The Exhibition is the culmination of students' experience in the Primary Years Programme where they draw on their learning throughout the program. Students are required to work collaboratively to inquire into an issue of local and global significance and to demonstrate knowledge, understanding and skills, while displaying the attributes of the IB learner profile and taking action on their learning. This year's Exhibition is based around the theme of *Sharing the planet*.

The presentation of the PYP Exhibition will involve students sharing their learning with the school community. In the past it has also been attended by members of the broader community, including grandparents and friends, past students and parents and students and teachers from other IB schools.

Foundation Unit of inquiry

Principled – acting with fairness and honesty and taking responsibility for our actions.

Our Foundation classes are inquiring into living things and how we care for them.

Central Idea: We share our environment with living things

Lines of Inquiry:

- Living and non-living things
- Basic needs of living things
- Looking after living things and their environments

They have started their unit by looking at the impact of litter on our environment and on the living things which are part of our environment and they are focusing on how recycling can help us care for the environment.



Year 2 Maths

Inquirers – nurture curiosity, developing skills for inquiry and research. Knowing how to learn independently and with others.

Our Year 2 classes have been looking into measurement in maths. In previous weeks they have worked on length and area. This week they were finding out about capacity. This topic is one that students learn about through hands-on activities, finding out for themselves about what capacity means and how to measure it, by exploring and testing.

SPOTLIGHT ON LOTE with Mrs Strickland and Mrs Sivour





