SPOTLIGHT ON MUSIC with Mr Hueppauff

Our Foundations, Year 1, 2 and 3 classes spent a lot of hard work getting ready for their concerts.

Foundation performed 3 little pigs, **Year 1's** – Croak and **Year 2/3's** – You are special. It was a lot of fun and we are proud of all their efforts this term.

Year 4's have been working on their Ukulele skills. Each student had to choose a nursery rhyme and practice it for several weeks. They had to practice playing the chords as well as sing at the same time. Some students came across chords they didn't know, so had to find and learn these new chords.

Students recorded what they sounded like at the start of their rehearsal period, the middle, and then the end.

Year 5's have been having fun with becoming the next MC Rappers. Students learnt what the rap genre is all about as well as the history of it. They were asked to compose and create a backing track for their rap as well as lyrics. Students recorded their raps onto GarageBand for their final performance.

Year 6's started out by inquiring into advertising. They were then asked to create a jingle to market a specific fruit. Groups had to write the lyrics and then compose the music. After they had the music, we then looked into the visual side of advertising. Students had to use the video editing app CapCut to create a visual clip to advertise their fruit.

On Wednesday our Year 1,2,4 and 6 classes were lucky to be invited to watch a performance of the classic musical "The Sound of Music" produced and performed by St Columba College. CURRICULUM UPDATE

The aim of all IB programs is to develop internationally minded people who can help to create a better and more peaceful world. Through the Primary Years Programme (PYP) students are encouraged to develop attributes of the IB Learner Profile.

Foundation Unit of inquiry

Knowledgeable – finding out about different ideas and issues and developing understanding.

Our Foundation classes are inquiring into the features of a safe and positive community

Central Idea: In a positive community we care for ourselves and others

Lines of Inquiry:

- Getting to know ourselves
- Building relationships with others
- Ways we can keep safe
- Healthy living

This week they travelled to the Road Safety Cycle Centre at Ridgehaven, where they looked at how to stay safe on the street and around traffic. They had a fun day of learning.

Year 1 Unit of inquiry

Our Year 1 students have been looking at communities and how they work for people.

Thinkers – analysing problems and thinking critically and creatively.

Central Idea: Places change to meet the needs of the community

Lines of Inquiry:

- Natural, managed and human-made features of our community
- How and why features of places change
- Caring for places

They have started by looking at the features of our school community and they enjoyed taking part in a scavenger hunt to help them explore our school and the different areas within our school. They explored maps and used them to solve problems and find clues.

Year 3 Unit of inquiry

Inquirers – nurturing curiosity and knowing how to learn independently and with others.

The Year 3 classes have been finding out about how people use and measure time.

Central Idea: Our lives are shaped by our understanding of time

Lines of Inquiry:

- How the movement of the earth affects time
- Different perspectives on understanding and measuring time
- Time and human activity

They have looked at different ways people have tried to measure time in the past. They have also been looking at how the movement of the earth affects the way we look at time and comparing this to the way other planets in our solar system move.



SLIME SPECTACULAR

Last Friday, students participated in the Slime Spectacular to raise money to improve the environment and our school. The kids had a great time running around in their sports day team colours and getting messy.
