Parent Information Evening (PIE Night)

Thanks to the P & F for putting on the Parent Information Evening this week. Parents had an opportunity to find out about some initiatives and programs being used at Immanuel Gawler for 2023. We looked at the Keeping Safe program, a child protection curriculum focused on equipping students to be safe by recognising safe and unsafe situations, healthy and unhealthy relationships and appropriate and inappropriate behaviours and interactions. The curriculum also helps students to identify networks of trusted people they can speak to.

We heard about literacy instruction, some of the focus areas and strategies and some of the background behind the structure of language and how students learn.

We also heard from Randall Murch, from SAPOL in Gawler, who spoke to us about staying safe online and how parents can help their children with this. Randall will be visiting classes in the next couple of weeks to talk to students about online safety.


Peaceful Kids program at Immanuel 2023 with Andrea White
