Foundation Literacy

<u>Communicators – expressing ourselves confidently and creatively</u>

Our Foundation students have been doing an amazing job of learning their letters and sounds and showing us how much they know. This week in their literacy lessons they have been putting their letters and sounds together to begin writing words.

Our Foundation students have also been working on being communicators in LOTE (Languages Other Than English), where they have been looking at how we express our emotions without using words.

Year 2 Unit of inquiry

Reflective – thoughtfully considering the world, our ideas and our experiences
The Year 2 classes have been learning about character strengths and how people can make use of these in their communities.

They have been hosting visitors from our teaching staff and from the parents/caregivers in our classes, who have talked about the different communities they are part of, their roles in these communities and the way their character strengths have helped them in these roles.

Year 4 Music

Communicators – expressing ourselves confidently and creatively


In music lessons this week, our Year 4 students have been looking at non-verbal communication and how we can communicate our feelings through facial expression. They got creative with their musical instruments, matching rhythms to facial expressions and adding movements to show different emotions.

Year 4 Maths

Thinkers – using critical and creative thinking skills to solve problems.

Maths lessons in Year 4 have been focusing on sorting and patterning. Students worked with a large range of different objects and materials, looked at their attributes and came up with different ways they could categorise them. This is a useful skill when it comes to recording and analysing data or recognising and working with patterns in maths.













SPOTLIGHT ON STEPHANIE ALEXANDER KITCHEN GARDEN PROGRAM (SAKGP)


We have had a terrific start to the year in the SAKGP Kitchen. Year 4s have started their lessons on a Wednesday morning, cooking some delicious recipes that have been focused mainly on reducing food waste and using up fresh produce in delicious ways. We have made Bliss balls, Fritters and Tiganites (Greek pancakes). Our adult volunteers have been amazing, coming in each week and cooking with a group.

The Year 6s have had a big focus on using fresh produce from the garden as it is available, making things like zucchini rosti, kale slaw, tomato tart and a really tasty mushroom, kale and potato frittata. We have also been able to use the dehydrators to dry some nectarines, saltbush and lemon myrtle leaves to use later. Another way we have used fresh produce is in a green tomato jam and nectarine chutney. We don't make many desserts but in Week 2 a group made a fantastic Bruschetta with nectarines. We have had a few discussions with students about being able to swap ingredients in recipes when some things are unavailable and we have other produce in abundance. We were able to swap out a cucumber and use pepino instead to make a zesty dip.

The year 6s have started thinking about their Street Eats recipes, linking with their LOTE languages and Unit of inquiry. They'll be planting some seedlings in their square metre garden in preparation for hopefully harvesting some produce to use next term.


What's something you've done, but will never do again? I tore both cruciate ligaments playing football — I'm planning not to do that again


DOG POLICY
