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MESSAGE FROM DARYL

I hope this newsletter finds you all doing OK.

This coming week we celebrate Reconciliation Week. It's my hope and prayer that ours is always an inclusive school that honours and respects all cultures and especially our First Nations people. The amazing mosaics at our entrances that say, 'Walking with God on Kaurna Land' highlight two very important pillars to us. If you have any resources (human and or physical) or ideas that can support our Reconciliation Week activities, we'd love to hear about them.

Rosie the School Therapy Dog is coming along in her training. Apart from being cute, she is smart and the Hueppauff family have been investing lots of time into her, as well as lots of professional training as well. Our original plan was to start Rosie at school at the start of 2024, but it looks like this could be even earlier! In the coming period you will be sent some correspondence about the programme but please feel free to ask any questions you have. We have done lots of research and continue to reflect, plan and think about this amazing addition to our school community, but we also would value any input/thoughts you have.

Quite some time ago I mentioned that we are planning on replacing the JP playground in the middle of the year. This started out as a compliance decision due to the inability of maintaining soft fall levels (due to the slope) in that area, and so we decided to rubberize the surface. This led to investigations regarding the playground and so the decision has been made to replace the lot!! The works for this will spread over a month or so and most of it will be done during the three week break. The new playground (very similar to the one in the Liberty development at Two Wells) will have a more imaginative element to it as well as strength and agility.

Covid is clearly doing the rounds at the moment and especially over the last week or so. This has caused (and is causing) some staffing challenges and we continue to encourage people with symptoms to test and let us know so we can ensure there's a continuing awareness. SA Health continue to recommend isolating for 5-7 days from the onset of symptoms and as a minimum we ask that kids be symptom free before returning after a positive test. **Daryl**






MARINE DISCOVERY FUN FOR YEAR 1

YEAR 1 MATHS – MEASUREMENT

YEAR 2 UNIT OF INQUIRY

They are going to great lengths to find information for this unit, using a time machine to discover some of the ways transport has changed over time and to explore the impact of some of the different developments in transport. 
