#### <u>Afternoon</u>


iGOSH staff sign all the children in.

#### Helpful Wellbeing Information for Families

**Worries and Fears in Children** - Worries, fears, and anxieties in children are a normal part of development and different worries or anxieties often develop at different stages of development. For example, School-age children might be afraid of;

- supernatural things (like ghosts)
- social situations, such as; being left out
- thunder and lightning
- separation anxiety
- the dark
- being alone
- failure
- criticism
- tests
- physical harm or threat, such as; car accidents, plane crashes, bad people hurting them

#### Ways to support children with their worries, fears and anxieties:

- Acknowledge your child's fear or worry and let them know that most children feel anxious sometimes. You can encourage your child to be kind to themselves when they feel this way.
- Gently encourage your child to do things they're anxious about, but don't push them to face situations they don't want to face.
- Wait until your child actually gets anxious before you step in to help.
- **Praise** your child for doing something they're anxious about.
- Avoid criticising your child for being afraid or worried.
- Avoid labelling your child as 'shy' or 'anxious'.

Again, recognise that most children have fears or worries of some kind. If you're concerned about your child's fears, worries or anxiety, it's a good idea to seek professional help. You might like to consider seeing your GP or another health professional.



## **CURRICULUM UPDATE**

#### Year 3 Unit of Inquiry

<u>Open-minded – appreciating our own culture and the values and traditions of others</u>

Our Year 3 students have started a new unit of inquiry which looks into culture. **Central Idea:** Understanding culture helps us appreciate each other

Lines of Inquiry: How people express their culture

Factors that influence culture Culture and religious belief

They began by discussing all of the different ways that groups can share their identity. They used Minecraft Education to create visual representations of some of the ideas they came up with.

#### Year 6 SAKG

#### <u>Balanced – understanding the importance of giving</u> <u>attention to the variety of different aspects of our lives</u>

Our Year 6 students have been preparing for a very special evening in Week 9, where they will be cooking meals from around the world. Their cooking will be linked to countries they have been studying in LOTE, where they have chosen a language to learn during the year. This all links to their latest unit of inquiry, which explores the ways people express their cultures.

**Central Idea:** Groups express themselves through their way of life

Lines of Inquiry: Traditional cuisine and adaptation

Connections between identity and language. Attributes that define cultures



Students have been using produce from the school garden and growing herbs they will use in the dishes they create. They have also been busy recently, preserving olives from our school trees.

#### Premiers' Reading Challenge

The Premiers' Reading Challenge is celebrating its 20th anniversary in 2023. The challenge involves reading 12 books over the course of the year, including 8 from the Premier's Reading Challenge list (<u>https://premiersreadingchallenge.sa.edu.au/book-list/</u>).

As part of the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Premier's Reading Challenge, students can take part in the 20 book challenge, where they read 20 books over the year. Students completing this challenge will win an additional award.

The Premier's Reading Challenge concludes on 8<sup>th</sup> September (Week 7, Term 3).

#### **ICAS Competitions**

ICAS competitions will be held again in 2023. Students can take part in a number of tests: Digital Technologies, Writing, English, Science, Spelling Bee and Mathematics. Testing for the competitions will take place in August. Further details will be sent out shortly.


