Mary the Mother of Jesus

When we think of Mary, we often have an image of a heavily pregnant woman riding on a donkey. We think of how she must have had an aching back, how weary she was and also the additional worries of birth- especially as a first time mum. We think so much about the pregnancy, we can forget the great lesson of patience, trust and obedience in the plans that God has for us. When we think about a teenage pregnancy, it is often met with disappointment, fear and uncertainty. This is the exact opposite of what Mary had as her reaction to the news that she would give birth and that the child she would give birth to would be the Son of God. This week while discussing the story of Mary and who she was for us as a woman of substance, we have been reflecting on these values with our preschool children.

Patience- Mary had to have patience. If you have had a small child of 3-5 years old, patience is something that comes with time and also, modelling. Mary had to wait for her baby, wait while she travelled to Bethlehem and be patient that they would find somewhere to rest once in Bethlehem.

Trust- an unwedded young girl in these times was taboo- what would society think of her? What would her fiancé think of her? When talking with our children, we have spoken about the unexpected surprise, when the Angel Gabriel announced that Mary would become with child, the Son of God. Mary certainly displayed trust that God had a plan for her, something that He promises us as His people too.

Obedience- Mary could have argued with God, been angry. Instead, she rejoiced, sharing the news with her cousin, Mary unwaveringly listened to God. As we learn more about the women of substance in the Bible, we pray that these qualities in Mary are ones that perhaps speak to your own life and serve as a reminder that we are God's chosen people, He cares for us, He has a plan. All we have to do is trust in His plan, patiently, with obedience to His instruction.

'The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary. God is very pleased with you. You will become pregnant and give birth to a son. You must call Him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High God.""

CURRICULUM UPDATE

Year 1 UOI - <u>*Reflective* – thoughtfully considering the world, our ideas and experience</u> Our Year 1 students have been learning about materials and their uses.

Central Idea: We understand more about materials by exploring them

Lines of Inquiry: The characteristics of materials

How materials change

How and why different materials are used

Over the last two weeks they have been taking part in a couple of investigations to test materials and designs. Last week they constructed boats and tested them to see if they would float. This week they built bridges to see how well they could hold different weights.

Year 2 UOI - *Inquirers* – *nurturing curiosity and developing skills for inquiry and research* Our Year 2 students have been working on a very interesting unit about technology, how it changes and the impact of these changes. They have been focusing on transportation for their investigations.

Central Idea: Technology changes the way people interact with their environment **Lines of Inquiry:** Changes to technology and human practices

Ways to manage impacts on the environment

Impacts of technological change

Last week they travelled to the Birdwood Motor Museum to see some real life examples of how changing technology has impacted transportation. It was a very engaging and informative day out.

Premiers' Reading Challenge

A reminder that the Premier's Reading Challenge concludes on 8th September (Week 7).

This year is a special version of the Premier's Reading Challenge, in celebration of its 20th anniversary. Students

may take part in the regular Premier's Reading Challenge, by

reading 12 books over the course of the year, including 8 from the Premier's Reading Challenge list (<u>https://premiersreadingchallenge.sa.edu.au/book-list/</u>).

This year they also have the opportunity to take part in the 20 book challenge, where they read 20 books over the year. Students completing this challenge will win an additional award.

ICAS Competitions

The first of our ICAS competitions is coming up soon. Digital Technologies and Writing competitions will be conducted next week, $7^{th} - 11^{th}$ August, with the English competition taking place the following week, $14^{th} - 18^{th}$ August.

IGOSH

New Booking App

We are now using the new Spike Booking App (we don't use care bookings). Information about downloading the App is on the website

- All account holders who require bookings at iGOSH need to download the App and use it for bookings.
- To log in to the new App you need to use the email address your iGOSH invoices are emailed to and your pin code you use on the electronic sign in.
- You can only book Permanent Bookings on the App. These are bookings made 2 days (48 hours) before the required session.
- Casual Bookings are bookings made with less than 2 days (48 hours) notice. These casual bookings can only be made by contacting the service.

To contact the service we ask that you continue to email / text Katrina. Please don't do this via the message service on the App

- Bookings made through the App automatically link with the Electronic Sign in.
- Casual Bookings will still be recorded on paper copy.

Students cannot be booked in at last minute or just turn up as bookings and staff ratio are capped.

- Cancellations can be made up to 12 hours before the session for no charge to apply. Cancellations with less than 12 hours notice are charged at the full rate. Cancellations with more than 12 hours notice can all be made through the App
- There are no part sessions (am 8.00 8.30 and pm 3.30 4.00 pm).
- There are only the full sessions available
