A Woman of Substance: Deborah

Just over 1,000 years before the coming of Jesus there existed Biblical Judges. These Biblical Judges were very different to our modern-day judges in that their role was to be a leader and ruler of the nation of Israel. They were military leaders who God raised up to rescue His people from the oppression of their enemies and establish justice and the practice of following God's ways.

One such Biblical Judge that God used to rescue the Israelites was Deborah. In a day and age when men were mainly leaders, it was significant that God raised up a woman leader too. Deborah was indeed a woman of substance who lived these words of Jesus: "Blessed...are those who hear the word of God and obey it." (Luke 11:28)

Through Deborah's life we learn that it's important to listen to and obey our leaders. Blessings abounded for God's people as they listened to and followed the directions of Deborah. Blessings abound for us as we listen to our Principal, teachers, school leaders and yes even our parents/carers! We might not always feel like listening to these people, but through their roles God blesses us

I hope this newsletter finds you all doing well.

The big news at school is that the Junior Primary Playground is finally complete! And it's good!

Next week (week 5) we will implement a slight change to the morning yard routine – Yr F / 1 / 2 will use the JP Courtyard and JP playground before school and Yr 3s and 4s will use Taikondi – this will hopefully give a bigger spread of students and bit less congestion. <u>Year 5 UOI</u> - <u>Reflective – thoughtfully considering the world, our ideas and experience</u> Our Year 5 students have been learning about migration.

Central Idea: Our society and history are influenced by migration

Lines of Inquiry: People's experiences of migration

Effects of migration on existing communities

Ongoing responses to migration

They shared their knowledge and experience of migration by bringing in artefacts which told a bit of a story about their own family history and the role migration had to play with this.

Year 4 UOI - Risk Takers – taking on challenges and trying new things

Our Year 4s have been looking at a unit on indigenous people, focusing particularly on Aboriginal Australians.

Central Idea: Indigenous peoples have unique connections to country

Lines of Inquiry: The beliefs and laws of indigenous

groups

How beliefs vary between cultures How contact with outsiders affects

indigenous groups

As part of this unit, they went on an indigenous focus camp at Aldinga. They had an awesome time

and learned a great deal, taking part in a wonderful range of experiences. They built wardlis (shelters), they hiked a nature trail with an Aboriginal guide who taught them about how Aboriginal people have used plants and animals for food, medicine and tools, they did some Aboriginal art and crafts, they took part in a variety of team building games and they cooked fish by wrapping it in clay and baking it in a fire (some even tried baked fish eyes!)

<u>New Booking App Reminders</u> - You can only book Permanent Bookings on the App. These are bookings made 2 days (48 hours) before the required session.

Casual Bookings are bookings made with less than 2 days (48 hours) notice. These casual bookings can only be made by contacting iGOSH direct.

Bookings made through the App automatically link with the Electronic Sign in Casual Bookings will still be recorded on paper copy.

Students cannot be booked in at last minute or just turn up as bookings and staff ratio are capped.

Cancellations can be made up to 12 hours before the session for no charge to apply. Cancellations with less than 12 hours notice are charged at the full rate. Cancellations with more than 12 hours notice can all be made through the App.

<u>Pupil Free Day</u> - Friday 15 September iGOSH will be open. If you require care on this day, please book via the Spike Booking App. We will have activities on offer, more information to come in the coming weeks.

<u>Planning and Programming</u> - All of our planning and programming is based around child voice, feedback and suggestions we gather from the children. From this, we then program activities which the children can participate in. We offer:

Programmed Activities, Cooking Class, Wellbeing walks and yoga and Themed Activity Areas like Fit and Fun, Art and Craft, Chill Out, Creative Corner and Zone free Play.

We create observations to share with you of activities that your child involves themselves in. These are shared on Seesaw. Each child at iGOSH also has a My iGOSH Life Book, which has a record of all their observations over their time here.
