

#### **FOUNDATION AND YEAR 6**



Through the Primary Years Program (PYP) students are encouraged to develop attributes of the IB Learner Profile: <u>Inquirers, Knowledgeable, Thinkers, Communicators, Principled, Open-minded, Caring, Risk-takers, Balanced and Reflective.</u>

#### Year 5 UOI

Our Year 5s have been inquiring into the way people express their ideas and have



been exploring different art forms and the work of different artists.

**Central Idea:** We use our imagination to express ideas creatively

#### **Lines of Inquiry:**

- What motivates creativity
- Different ways of expressing ideas
- Critiquing and reflecting on artistic expression

They have been looking at pop art and came up with some fantastic pieces based on the work of Roy Lichtenstein which they created with the help of their iPads.

#### **Languages Other Than English (LOTE)**

Our Foundation students have been looking all year at the different languages people use all around the world. They have been learning some German this term and sharing different greetings as well as learning the names of the different colours.

In Year 6, students are beginning to prepare for the PYP Exhibition, and as part of this they will be exploring issues in the countries they have been learning about in their LOTE lessons.

In Indonesian, some of our Year 1-5 classes have been practising language people would use when shopping. They set up juice stalls and sold juice to their customers, using conversations in Indonesian.
