MESSAGE FROM DARYL

I hope this newsletter finds you doing well.

In following up from the questions raised in our recent survey, one was around 'when/how do we let parents/caregivers know about behaviour matters.' This is often a tricky and vexing dilemma for staff. On one hand we highly value partnership and working with families, but at the same time we don't want to swamp you with trivial or small matters!

It's generally when the small or trivial matters escalate or we feel we're not getting on top of behaviours that we reach out to families to let them know. When we do this the aim is to build awareness and understanding and to also work together to ensure we can optimize the learning environment for children. We're conscious of the feedback we sometimes get along the lines of, 'We didn't know about this and should have known earlier...' through to passing on every little detail. In terms of communication, we will sometime email and sometimes call/touch base in person. This will depend on the context and issue and we try very hard to follow up matters as quickly as we can.

Our staff have been working on an upgrade to our 'Managing Student Behaviour Policy' and this will be shared with families at the start of next year and we expect it will give some clarity to families in this area. The policy will be centred around our four (new) values of Love, Grace, Quality, Teamwork and especially how they relate to the areas of Safety, Respect and Learning. Key goals are to ensure a school environment which protects everyone's right to respect, safety and learning and to help all students to develop self-management skills they will need for life beyond primary school. We see parents/caregivers as key stakeholders and critical partners in helping students develop these skills and helping us create this environment. Our communications with parents are aimed at promoting these goals and keeping parents in the loop as partners and stakeholders.

In recent times we have been meeting with students (either as cohorts or as the whole school) to give proactive reminders. We really value the sense of partnership we have with our families in this area as well as the trust you have in us as we try hard to instill the basic and bottom line belief we hold around 'treating other people the way you like to be treated.'

It's a busy time of the year here at school with lots of things going on as we work hard to ensure we finish this year well and also as we set up for the new year to come. Blessings to you all.

YEAR 1 SLEEPOVER FUN



CURRICULUM UPDATE CONTINUED....

Year 1 UOI - Our Year 1 classes have been looking at families in the past and how they have changed over time.

Central Idea - Family life reflects changes in society Lines of Inquiry

- Changes in families and households
- How people spend their time
- Impact of changes in society

Last week the Year 1s had their sleepover and as part of this, they had a visit from the Australian Childhood Museum toy man. He came to the school and shared all kinds of toys which children played with in the past. The Year 1 students had a wonderful time investigating these and trying to find out how they worked.

Year 3 UOI - Our Year 3 classes have been looking into heat.

Central Idea - Understanding the properties of heat allows people to use it in different ways Lines of Inquiry:

- Ways heat is produced
- Changes caused by heat
- Challenges with using, storing and transferring heat

They have been conducting different experiments to find out what happens when different materials are heated, which materials are good for conducting heat and which materials can be used for insulation. They are constructing some solar ovens based on what they have been finding out.

Year 4 UOI - Our Year 4 classes have been inquiring into water, the water cycle and the ways water is used.

Central Idea - Understanding water enables people to use it in a variety of ways Lines of Inquiry:

- Processes in the water cycle
- Properties and behaviour of water
- How humans use water

They have had a great time and shown some fantastic creativity developing models to show different ways water is used and the way different systems of water use operate.

Year 5 UOI - Our Year 5 classes have been finding out about living things.

Central Idea - Understanding living things enables them to be utilised Lines of Inquiry

- How living things survive and adapt
- How humans adapt by understanding specific habitats
- How people use technology to aid adaptation

Last week they had a visit to the Adelaide Zoo and were fortunate enough to take part in a workshop run by zookeepers on the topic of animal adaptation. It was a very enjoyable day.


