iGOSH

<u>iGOSH Bookings</u> - All bookings are required to be made through the Spike Parent Booking App. Access to the App can only happen once iGOSH enrolment forms have been lodged with the service. You can only book Permanent Bookings on the App. These are bookings made 2 days (48 hours) before the required session.

Casual Bookings are bookings made with less than 2 days (48 hours) notice. These casual bookings can only be made by contacting the service. Please ring / email or text Katrina.

Students cannot just turn up as bookings and staff ratio are capped.

Cancellations can be made up to 12 hours before the session for no charge to apply. This needs to be made through the App. Cancellations with less than 12 hours notice are charged at the full rate. Please cancel by email, ring or text Katrina.

Invoices / Payment - Weekly invoices are emailed each Tuesday morning

We encourage all families to lodge a direct debit form. Direct Debit payments are processed between 1-4pm each Friday

If not using the Direct Debit option families must pay their invoices by 1pm each Friday via Bank Transfer, EFTPOS or cash at the front office.

If accounts are outstanding at 1pm Friday then the booking app / future bookings will be blocked, the week ahead bookings will be cancelled until the payment is received In summary accounts are strictly 7 days

<u>A brief summary about iGOSH</u> - Bookings are essential as we have child:staff ratios to adhere too. All children need to have a hat when at igosh. This can be left in their bag or an extra hat purchased from iGOSH \$13) and left in our hat drawers.

Sunscreen is compulsory when the UV is 3+. We have a sunscreen station where we encourage children to apply sunscreen.

We cater for dietary needs and we work closely with the school for medications that children require. So please keep us updated with any changes either dietary or medical.

<u>Mornings</u> - We open at 6.45am, We offer breakfast from 6.45 - 8.15am, included in the fees Children are dismissed to school at 8.30am

<u>Afternoons</u> - Children sign in from school at 3.25pm, We offer a fruit / vegetable snack at 3.30pm and a light snack at 4.30pm. We have a supervised homework time from 3.45-4.15 each afternoon. Please refer to the clipboard on our front desk for more information.

<u>Vacation Care</u> - We offer onsite and offsite days. The program comes home around week 6 of each term. Bookings are made through the booking App. Consent forms will be on Operoo <u>Zion Preschool</u> - We provide a bus service to and from Zion Preschool for all preschool children who are enrolled at Immanuel. iGOSH offers care on Friday mornings and afternoons as well, due to the later start and early finish at preschool.

<u>Seesaw</u> - We use Seesaw as our main communication with updates and sharing observations and learning stories. Please check this regularly and we hope you enjoy reading about all the fun things your child does at iGOSH.

We welcome all the new children and families to our service. We are looking forward to a fun year.

Daly Street Car Park

If you need to head up School Lane, enter via the Daly Street Car park entrance – go around the Kiss and Drop drive through - and then turn left at the end.

SPOTLIGHT ON WELLBEING WITH - HEIDI GOGOLL

This year we have focused heavily on wellbeing in our back-to-school routines. We recognise that the first few weeks of school play an integral part of developing the ongoing relationships and genuine connection required for a successful year. Thus, the curriculum in the first 2 weeks has been about connection, relationships, positive social emotional skills and learning about the school values of LOVE, GRACE, TEAMWORK and QUALITY.

All classrooms have covered concepts such as, warm welcomes, 'you are unique and valued', equality vs equity, healthy relationships, social scenarios, identifying and managing emotions, calming strategies, positive thinking, building your own toolkit, etc. It's been wonderful to see children increasing their emotional literacy, reflecting, growing their social skills across different contexts, and sharing about themselves. We will continue to support these base social emotional learning and wellbeing concepts across the remainder of the year.

CURRICULUM UPDATE

This year there have been a number of changes to the way our school day looks and with some of our learning activities. We have started with a focus on building positive classroom cultures across the school and exploring our school's core values: Love, Grace, Quality and Teamwork.

Visual Arts - One significant change has been the introduction of Visual Arts as a specialist subject area. There is a new art room and we have two new visual arts teachers: Mrs Kreymborg (Years 1, 2, 3, 5 and 6) and Mrs McDonald (Foundation and Year 4).

All of our classes have had an opportunity now to be involved in teaching visual arts. Here are our Year 2 students, learning about how to use line and colour.

Year 3 - Our Year 3 classes had a chance to do some interesting work with cartooning. They looked at how cartoonists can exaggerate facial features to show different expressions. We found there were some very creative budding cartoonists in Year 3.



Year 5 - Our Year 5 students used teamwork, creativity and problem solving skills to take part in some STEM challenge activities. They had a go at the egg drop challenge, designing and creating models to help them drop eggs from the Warrinthi balcony without breaking them. There were some success stories, but sadly a few casualties as well.
