CURRICULUM UPDATE

It has been a busy term, with many of our classes wrapping up their inquiry units.

Year 3

Over the space of two weeks our Year 3s have travelled to Monarto and Tailem Bend to take part in their camp. The camp covers two of the Year 3 inquiry units — one on

living things and another on places and change. They visited Old Tailem Town to look at how places were designed by people in the past. Then they stayed overnight at Monarto Zoo and spent some time finding out about living things and their classification.

Year 4

Our Year 4 students have been continuing with their inquiry into water, ecosystems and sustainability.

They have been looking at how people use water and what happens to the water once it has been used. This week they started looking at water quality and some of the ways we can test water quality. They began by carrying out some pH testing and finding out how litmus paper reacted in the presence of acid and alkaline substances.

Year 5

Our Year 5 students have been working on persuasive texts as part of their most recent inquiry unit. Their unit is based on Australia and the establishment of British colonies, and they have been finding out about the reasons behind the setting up of these colonies. This week the students had an opportunity to present some of their findings to their classmates.
