In our bible focus story this week (Luke 13) we learn about a fig tree that is under threat of being chopped down because it's not bearing fruit. In the story a gardener pleads not to do this and to give it another chance. He's confident that with some loving this tree can and will come good.

It's a story that resonates with my life as at times I know the fruit I'm producing is pretty ordinary. Barely second grade at best.

And I also know that to produce good fruit I need the loving of our heavenly green keeping Father who waters, fertilises and prunes my life.

So what fruit does God want us to bear?

Have a read of Galatians 5.

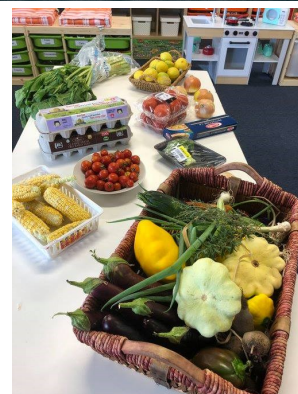
The students loved the bunny games and Easter Egg hunt too.

Last Friday 22 March the year 5s went to Adelaide to visit the Central Markets, the Migration Museum and Rundle Mall.

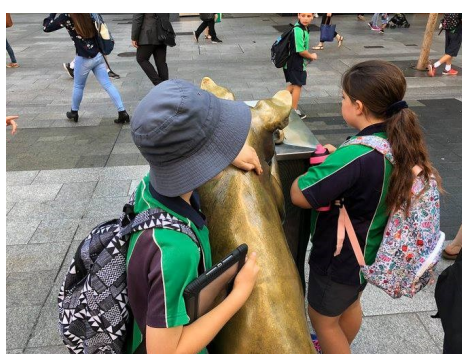
Mr Tiller's class caught the train into Adelaide and Mrs Kreymborg's class travelled there on the new school bus. Coming home the classes swapped over transport.

This was related to our Unit of Inquiry on "How society and history are influenced by migration".

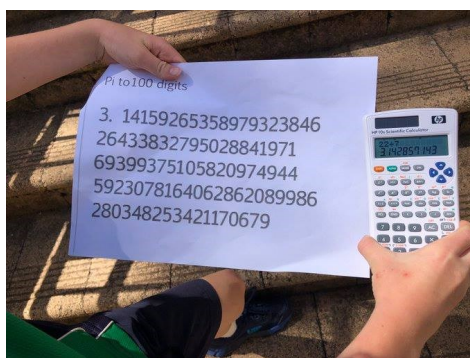
