SCHOOL DAY / PUNCTUALITY

The school day <u>begins at 8.50am</u>. Students who arrive **after 9am** are considered <u>late</u> and need to be signed in at the office by the parent / caregiver. If your child is **absent** please ensure you advise the school by 9.30am (via phone or email)

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Winter Uniform is to be worn for **Term 2 and 3**. This refers to the **formal uniform** which is grey trousers and long sleeve shirt for boys and the pinafore (or skirt) with white blouse for girls (with / without the green jumper). **Sports uniform** consists of shorts or trackpants with T-shirt and rugby top. There is a 2 week changeover at the start of the term - so if the weather is unseasonably warm summer uniform can be worn (but not a mix of both).

VOLUNTEERING, TRAINING AND CHECKS REQUIRED

- We really appreciate parents and caregivers helping at Immanuel with reading, excursions, camps etc.
- Those who volunteer in a school environment need to have completed
 - 1. 'Valuing Safe Communities' training and
 - 2. Provide a copy of a current police check or obtain a WWCC check. Both of these have a life span of three years.
- As from 1 July 2019 there will be stronger, nationally consistent screening laws for people wanting to work or volunteer with children in South Australia. The new laws require people working or volunteering with children to have a valid working with children check (WWCC), replacing the current system where people can have either a national police check assessment or a DHS screening. More info can be found at https://screening.sa.gov.au/
- From 1 July 2019, a WWCC can only be issued by the DHS Screening Unit. Our school is a registered business to initiate this check. To apply you will need to provide your full name, date of birth and an email address to Jenny (authorised person) in the office. There is no cost to apply as a volunteer in a school. If you have a current police clearance this will still be valid for a 3 year period, following this you will need to provide a WWCC check.
- Valuing Safe Communities' training will be held with Daryl Trigg on Wednesday 15 May at 2.30pm and 6.30pm. If you attended this training in 2016, your certificate has now expired so you will need to attend the training again this vear.

COLD AND FLU PRECAUTIONS: Is Your Child Too Sick for School?

A sniffle. A cough. A sore throat. A sore tummy.

Children come down with illnesses big and small. Some are contagious, and some aren't. We are at the beginning of a tough flu season with a much higher rate in SA than in previous years. If your child shows symptoms of a cold or flu we ask that you keep your child at home in order to prevent further spreading of infection.

We are encouraging children to wash hands before eating and to use hand sanitiser when returning from the playground.


