NEW INFORMATION ON VOLUNTEER CHECKS

- We really appreciate parents and caregivers helping at Immanuel with reading, excursions, camps etc.
- Those who volunteer in a school environment need to have completed
 - 1. 'Valuing Safe Communities' training and
 - 2. Provide a copy of a current police check or obtain a WWCC check. Both of these have a life span of three years.
- As from 1 July 2019 there will be stronger, nationally consistent screening laws for people wanting to work or volunteer with children in South Australia. The new laws require people working or volunteering with children to have a valid working with children check (WWCC), replacing the current system where people can have either a national police check assessment or a DHS screening. More info can be found at https:// screening.sa.gov.au/
- From 1 July 2019, a WWCC can only be issued by the DHS Screening Unit. Our school is a registered business to initiate this check. To apply you will need to provide your full name, date of birth and an email address to Jenny (authorised person) in the office, and a government form will be emailed to you to complete and submit. There is no cost to apply as a volunteer in a school.
 - If you have a current police clearance this will still be valid for a 3 year period, following this you will need to provide a WWCC check.
- Valuing Safe Communities' training will be held with Daryl Trigg every term. Next session is Wednesday 7 August at 2.30pm and 6.30pm.
 - If you attended this training in 2016, your certificate has now expired so you will need to attend the training again this year.

GOVERNMENT CIVICS EDUCATION REBATE PROGRAM

Year 6 students have recently undertaken an education tour of the national capital. Students were given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education.

To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government has contributed funding of \$60 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. A discount was included in the pricing of the camp for parents and so the rebate will be paid directly to the school.

PYP CURRICULUM THIS WEEK IN YEAR 2 AND YEAR 4

The **Year 2 classes** have been looking at **role models**; who they are, why they are role models and what characteristics they have that we value.

Central Idea:

How and why we choose role models Role models in different times and places Influence of other people on our choices and actions

The classes have researched different role models and constructed some fantastic **biography boxes** to tell people all about them.

The Year 4 classes have been inquiring into sustainability.

Central Idea:

We have a responsibility to live sustainably

Lines of Inquiry:

- Ways we manipulate the environment
- World views on caring for the Earth
- Strategies for sustainable resource management

As part of their inquiry, they have been doing some coding work with Mr Cochrane in **digital technologies** sessions. They have used their iPads to design some games to help promote sustainability. They have really enjoyed making their games and sharing them.





















YEAR 5 CURRICULUM

Our Year 5 students have commenced a unit looking at justice systems and how they operate. Central Idea:

Justice systems affect and reflect the communities people live in **Lines of Inquiry:**

Purposes of justice systems,
 Elements of justice systems,
 Effectiveness of justice systems

They started their unit with a visit to the Old Adelaide Gaol as part of their camp, focusing on the corrections area of the justice system. They will also look at law making, law enforcement and the court system.
