If you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise.

In other words.... think like an Australian and don't think of yourself as being better than anyone else.... remember that God sees everyone the same... and that his promises apply to all who call on his name.

Big words are never as impressive as the little word called 'grace'.

#### **The Primary Years Program**

#### Integrating technology - Year 3

The use of technology in the Primary Years Program gives students great opportunities to investigate, create, communicate, collaborate, organise and be responsible for their own learning.

Our Year 3 students took part in a very engaging unit on animal habitats as part of their *Sharing the planet* theme. Students were excited about inquiring into different animals and the issues which impact on them. As part of their unit they created some amazing interactive posters, tying their research into some work they had been doing with Mr Cochrane by combining Makey-Makey technology with the Scratch.mit.edu coding program. This has enabled students to record voiceover for a poster which has added extra information, turning a simple poster into an interactive project.





#### Integrating technology - Foundation

Our Foundation students have been using technology to help them with their writing. They have been working with iPads to put together animated stories and record their own narration. This has allowed them to practice with developing ideas and using narrative structure and vocabulary. It has been great to see the creativity and engagement they have shown with this.





#### Hands on learning – Foundation

The PYP encourages students to learn by doing and develop understandings through inquiring into questions and testing different possibilities.


Last week the Foundation class had a wonderful opportunity to do this when they hosted a visit by Mobile Science Education as part of their current unit of inquiry.

In preparing for their restaurants, students brought in learning from many different areas of the curriculum – sourcing and cooking food in the Kitchen Garden program, developing marketing programs as part of their unit of inquiry, including writing and recording advertising jingles with music, and budgeting for their restaurants in their maths lessons.
