I was more interested in how the lunch time footy teams were being cut, shut and sorted into two lines. I also remember learning about Blaxland, Wentworth and Lawson and thinking they were pretty great at sorting out big division problems.

I know that when someone dies and the estate is divided up, this can be one of the biggest causes of division ever.

Division....By and large we don't like it.

So when Jesus says in this week's bible focus story that he has come to cause division, we read a verse that's pretty challenging....

Luke **12:51** Do you think I came to bring peace on earth? No, I tell you, but division. From now on there will be five in one family divided against each other, three against two and two against three. They will be divided, father against son and son against father, mother against daughter and daughter against mother, mother-in-law against daughter-in-law and daughter-in-law against mother-in-law."

This scripture is quite separate from the image we usually have of 'gentle Jesus meek and mild'.

This is a scripture that reminds us that following Jesus will mean that we may have to track in a different direction and path to others, sometime even from our own family.

SURVEY FEEDBACK

- We had over 100 school families respond to our recent survey and the feedback given will be invaluable as we refine and plan for the future. There was some consistent input and thoughts around homework, uniform and iPad usage which we will take on board as well as significant feedback about potential bus runs. In the 'general comment' section there was a definite positivity, especially around iGOSH which is pleasing.

REFURBISHMENTS

- Many of you will be aware that over the last 12 months we have been working and planning on developing a new block of classrooms between the current senior unit and the Admin building – along from the library. We began that process with the opportunity for parents/caregivers to meet and feed into the plans and we are currently working on planning consent from the local Gawler Council. It is hoped that this project will start early in 2020 and be completed later that year.
- Following that we are also planning for a major renovation of the classrooms that are currently for Yr 2s and Yr 3 – opening the area up and creating a greater flexibility. Grant submissions for this as well as architectural plans have been developed.




GIANT WHEELBARROW RAFFLE


Celebrating Science Week

We had a wonderful time learning about and experimenting with **Science** stuff in Week 4 and our celebration spilled over into Week 5 too.




