THE PRIMARY YEARS PROGRAM



Year 1 Unit of Inquiry

Central Idea: "Things People Do & Use Change Over Time"

As a contribution to our current UOI, where the central idea is "Things people do and use change over time" and for our lines of inquiry "changes in technology, impact of change and changes in people's daily lives" we are looking at how cars have changed over time and what impact that has had on our lifestyles.

We had a visit from Garry & Adrian with some vintage cars to have a look at. The children were able to investigate the similarities and differences between new cars and vintage cars, and even sit in them to feel the comfort changes over the years!

The cars we looked at were a 1969 Triumph Spitfire and a 1932 Vauxhall.



Year 2

Central Idea: Ecosystems consist of interdependent organisms

Lines of Inquiry:

- How plants grow and change
- The ways plants and animals depend on each other to survive
- Our responsibility to care for living things

Our Year 2 classes visited the wetlands at Urrbrae as part of their unit on ecosystems. They looked at different animals, birds and plants around the wetlands and then spent some time catching and examining macro-invertebrates. Students had a great opportunity to see and learn about wetland ecosystems.

Central Idea:

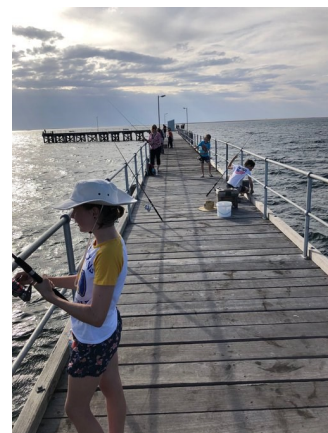
People work in groups to achieve their goals

Students chose from a range of possible camps: **camping, fishing, sporting, music, horse riding and cooking**. While students were on camp, they took part in group work challenges as part of their year-long unit of inquiry. They had a great time and lots of stories to share when they returned.



Our Year 5 students also presented a fantastic exhibition of art work in Taikondi as part of their most recent unit of inquiry.

YEAR 4 CAMP



Last week the Year 4's went on an **Urban Camp** experience.

It was a 2 night camp in the city and inked in with two of the PYP Units of Inquiry based on the Central Ideas, '*Indigenous peoples have unique connections to country*' and '*Colonial powers raced to monopolise resources*'.

It started on Wednesday by going to the **planetarium** and learning about our solar system. This was a fun experience as most students had never been. Then it was onto **Oaklands Wetlands** to have lunch, explore the wetlands area and talk about this man made system and look how it was set out. Then onto the accommodation at **Warradale Urban Camp School** where there was some free time, food and bed.

On day two students headed into Adelaide and visited the **Museum, Botanic Gardens and Central Market**. This was as a focus on Indigenous culture and looked at the ways Indigenous people lived and see how connected they are to the world. In the end the heat got the better of us and we cut it short so we could cool down. Catching the train to and from the city was a great opportunity for kids.

On the last day Friday we visited the **Maritime Museum** and participated in an **iPad inquiry, light house climb, boat ride and museum visit**. This connected to our Unit of Inquiry on colonial powers. With a brief stop at **St Kilda playground** we finished our trip off. A great time was had by the classes and it was a great trip. Here are some comments.
