## Remember and Connect

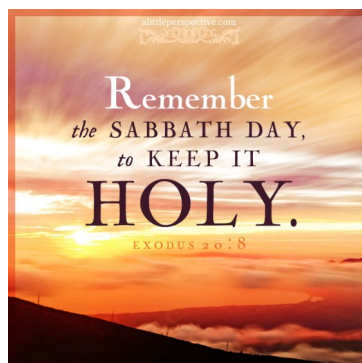
I have never been quite sure whether **Sunday** is the first or the last day of the week.

- We have just emailed a draft schedule to those families who registered their interest.
- Over the last weeks and months we've been investigating the feasibility of running a bus service in our local area before and after school.
- The great news is that this is indeed viable and will commence at the start of 2020.
- As much as possible it will be a 'door to door' service and the route will be from Immanuel through Willaston, Hewett, Hillier, Evanston Gardens, Evanston and back to Immanuel via Gawler East.

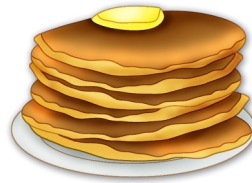

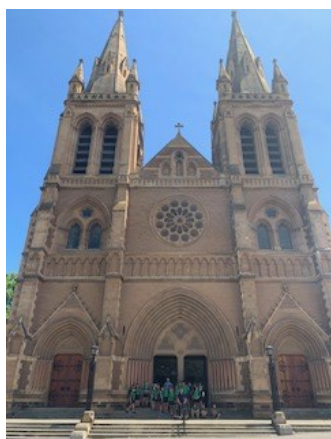


### Student Reports

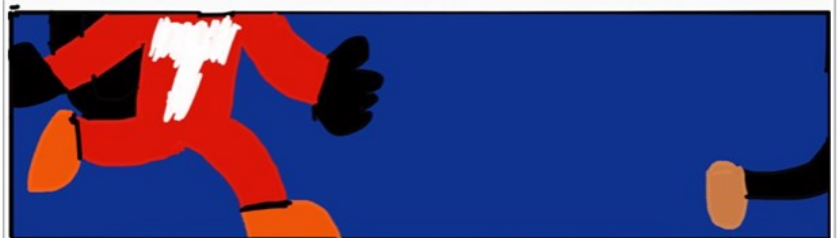

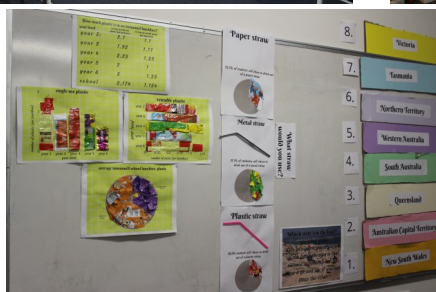
## THE PRIMARY YEARS PROGRAM
