If you go there now you won't see it either because it's sitting at the bottom of the Thames!



Turns out Robert Milligan used the wealth he'd built (by owning 500 slaves) to help build the docks there.

History is full of things we'd rather forget.

And the slave trade is a part of history that's unforgettable - for over 400 years over ten million people were rounded up and shipped to the other side of the world and forced in to slave labour. (Having read up a bit about this now I'll never complain again about all the jobs my wife gives me to do during the holidays..)

My hero of Faith this week is John Newton - the person who wrote Amazing Grace and the same person who was instrumental in abolishing the slave trade. Truly amazing.

In his letters Paul often writes about slavery and he even says he's a slave to Jesus Christ. Paul felt like he was a slave to sin (as I know I often am) and so he cherishes the concept of freedom... a slave to Christ, the one who sets us free! Paul's another Hero of Faith I reckon.

BUILDING WORKS AT IMMANUEL

"NUT AWARE" School

Primary Years Program Term 2

Year 2 Unit of Inquiry

The Year 2 classes have started a unit, inquiring into different places around the world.

Primary Years Programme

Central Idea:

The world is made up of interconnected places

Lines of Inquiry:

- How the world is divided up
- Connections, places and people
- Significance of natural and built places


They began their unit by looking at what they already know. They drew maps of the world to show their knowledge.





Year 2 Maths

The Year 2 classes also had an interesting time in maths, where they used Skittles to help them understand fractions.



The Year 5 classes have started a new unit, inquiring into migration.

Central Idea:

Our society and history are influenced by migration

Lines of Inquiry:

- People's experiences of migration
- Effects of migration on existing communities
- Ongoing responses to migration

With all our units, we begin with a provocation to help students tune in and start thinking about some of the issues that may be raised during the unit. In Year 5, students completed a citizenship test and talked about how these work and what they were like in the past. Some students found them extremely difficult (see example).

Year 4 Unit of Inquiry

Our Year 4 students are completing their inquiries into colonialism and they have made some excellent videos to show what they have been learning. They looked at different groups of people, their experiences of migration and how things might have looked from their different perspectives.









Primary Years Programme

Year 6 Unit of Inquiry

This term year 6's have been inquiring about the decision making processes in societies.

As a part of their inquiry, they researched seven areas relating to the understandings of civics and citizenship within Australia. This culminated in students displaying their thinking skills by creating an original game transferring their new found knowledge. They all did a fantastic job.

Year 3 Christian Studies

The Year 3 classes are currently involved in studying a Christian Studies unit on some of the spiritual practices of the church. Pastor Geoff was kind enough to come in to visit the classes and talk to them about the Christian practices of baptism and holy communion. The students were very engaged and had a lot of great questions for Pastor Geoff.





Year 6 Maths

Have you ever wondered what you could do with balloons and a table? This week Year 6 Mrs Eckermann's Class asked "What fraction of our class could stand on the upside down art table on a bed of balloons before the first one pops?"

They thought that when 12 got on the table the balloons would pop.

What happened?

To their amazement 16 people (which was 8/9th of the class) including their teacher, were easily able to stand on the table and no balloons popped! Isn't science incredible!
